Cut the new styrene using scissors or a rotary cutter.

Step 3: Attach the Fabric or Paper

Now, place your fabric or paper face down on a table. Spray adhesive onto the styrene's smooth side and place it sticky-side down onto the fabric. Smooth out wrinkles with your hands or a ruler.

Step 4: Tuck and Seal the Edges

Fold the fabric or paper over the top and bottom of the frame and glue it down. This gives your shade a clean, finished look. This step can take a bit of patience, especially with curved, <u>roundlamp shades</u> or small chandelier shades.
